The Tennessee CD 07 GOP Special Primary Survey was conducted by IVR and Online Interviews from August 19 - August 23 among a random sample of 500 likely special election voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.4 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

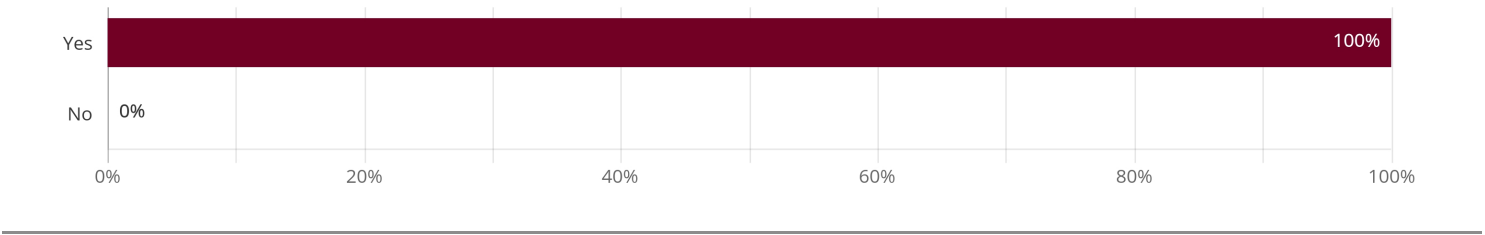

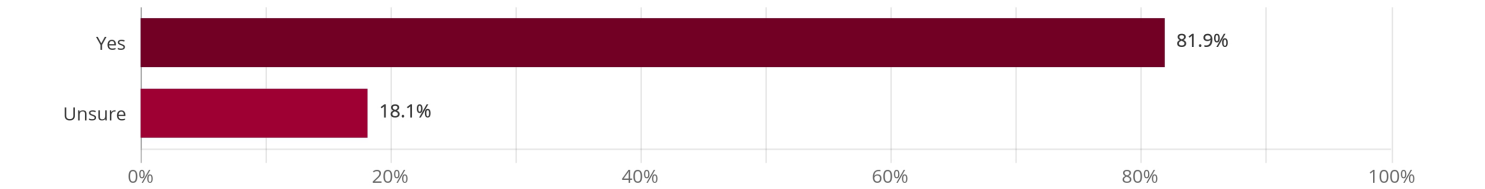

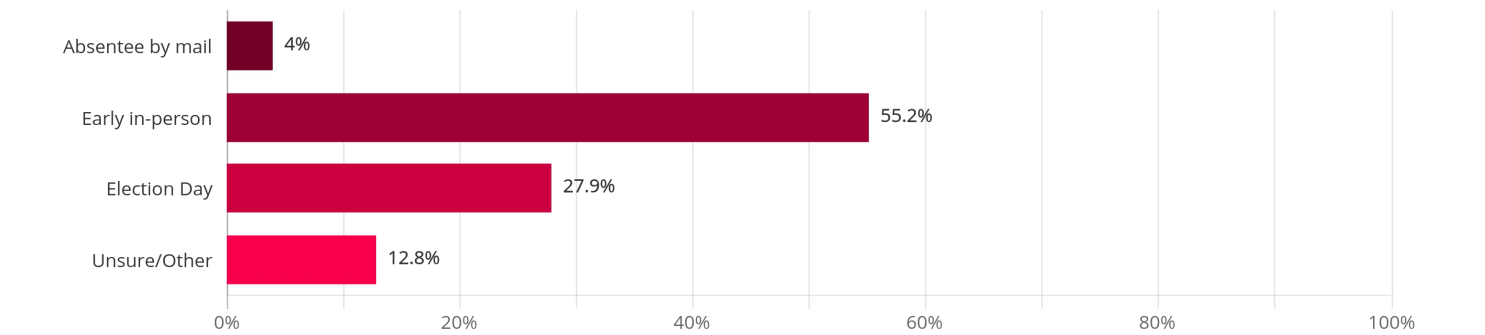

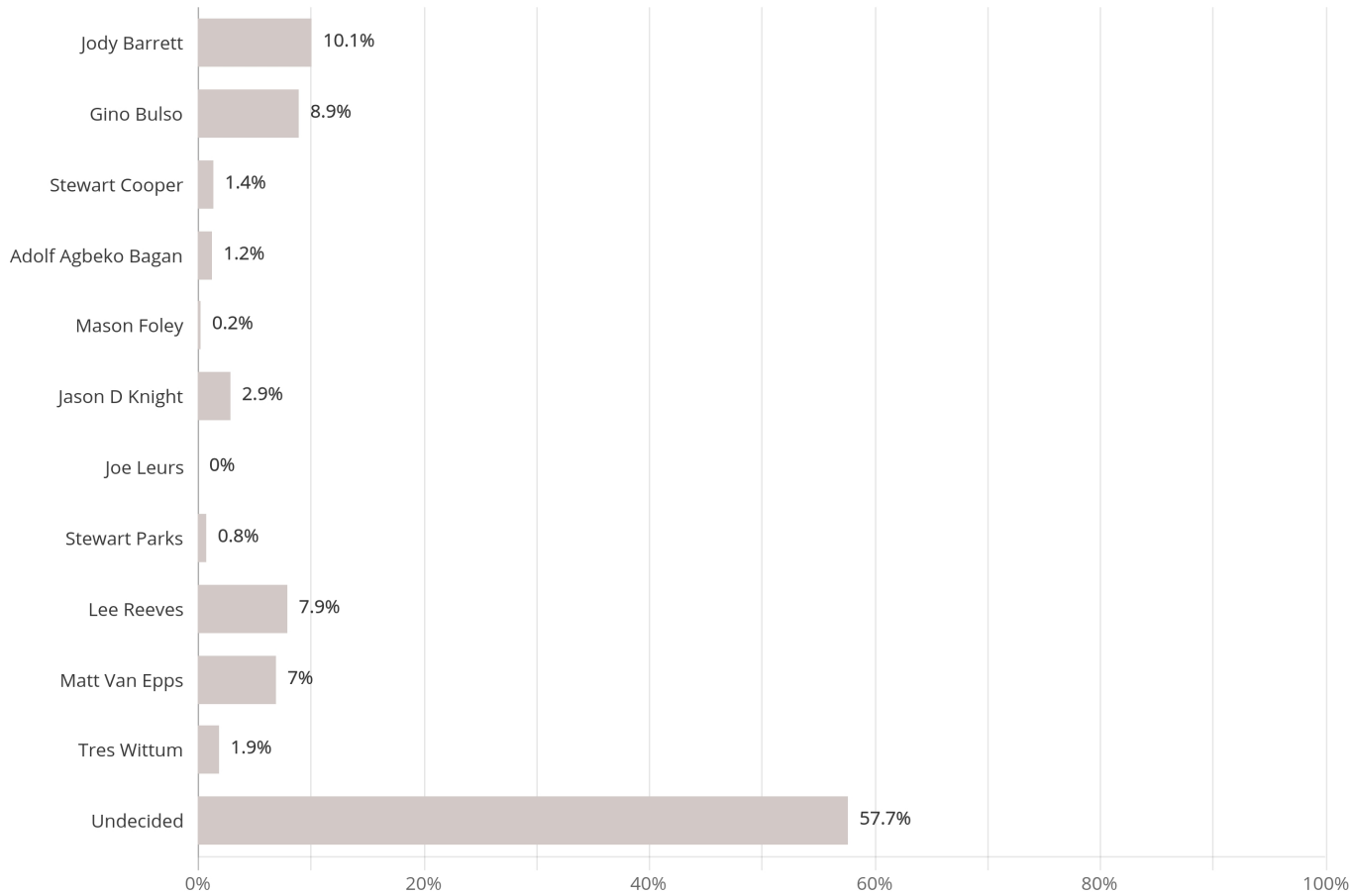

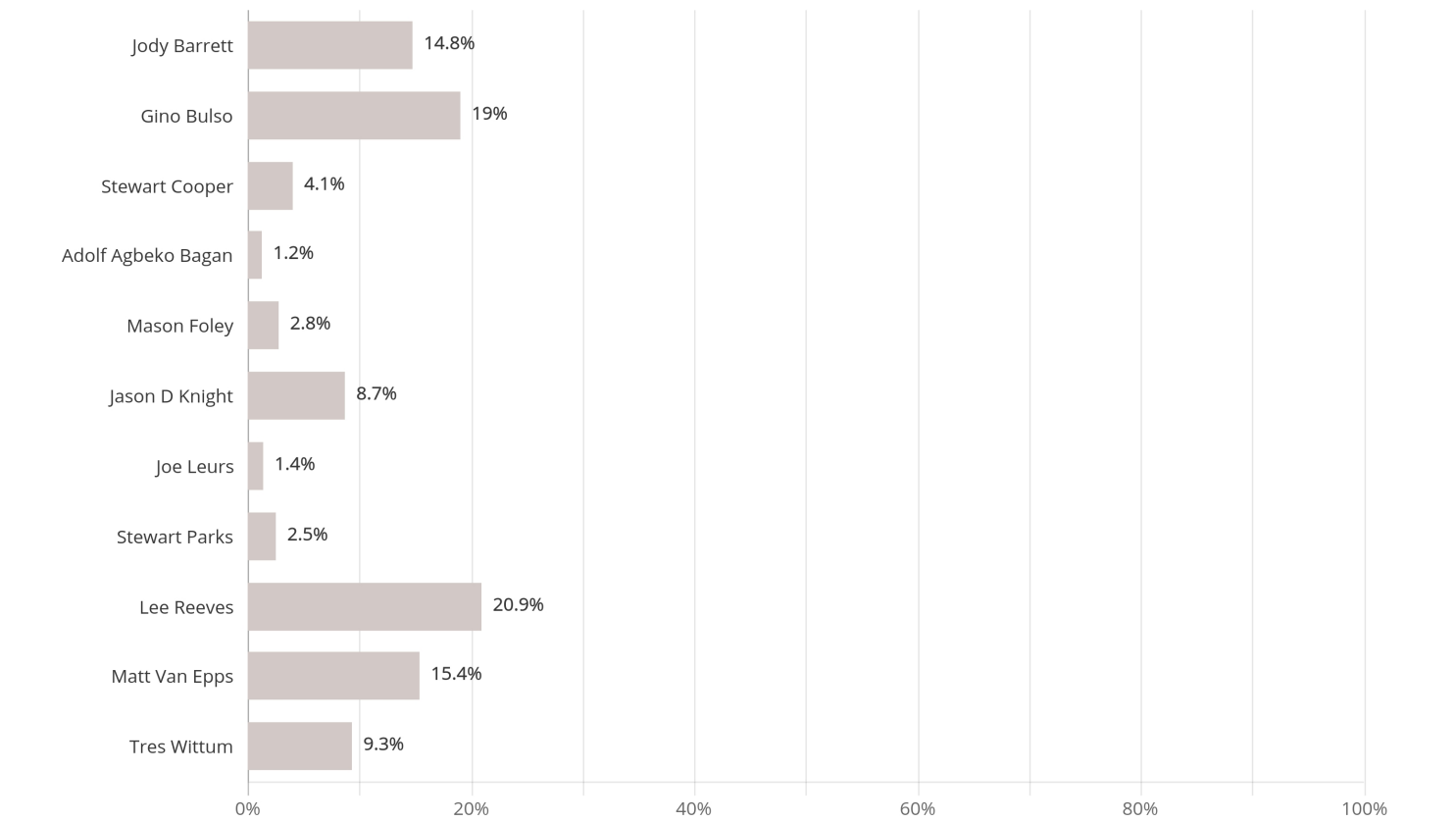

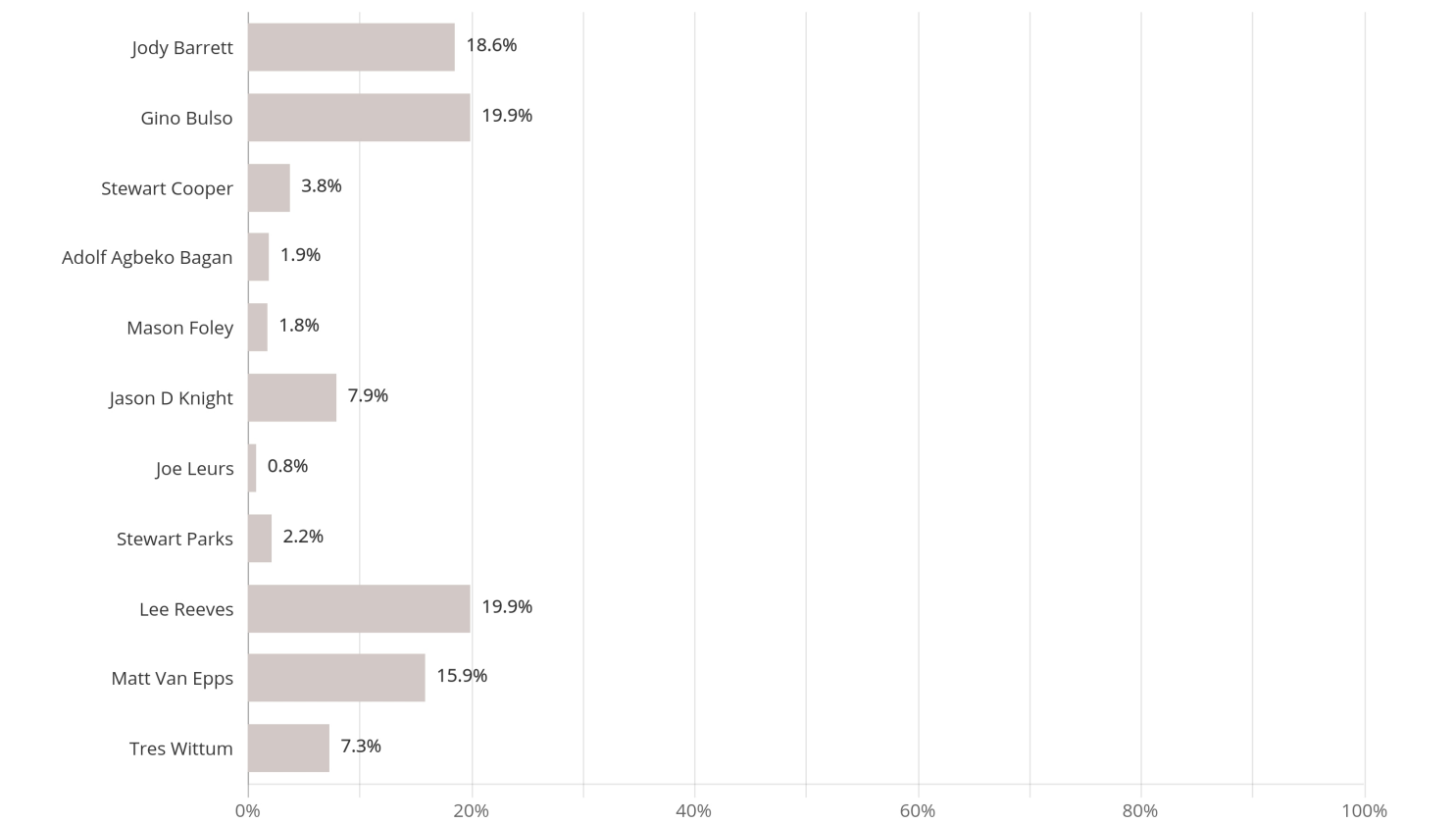

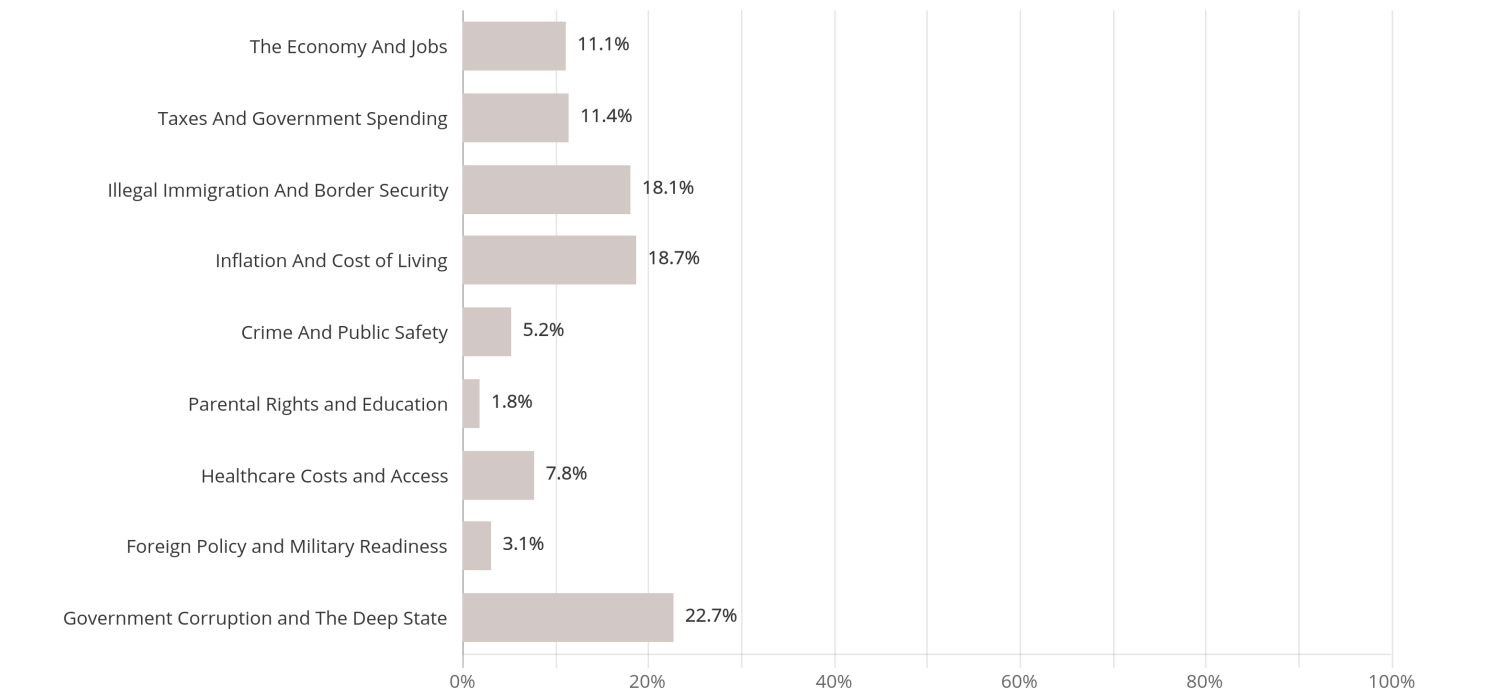

What is the most important issue you want your next Republican member of Congress to focus on?

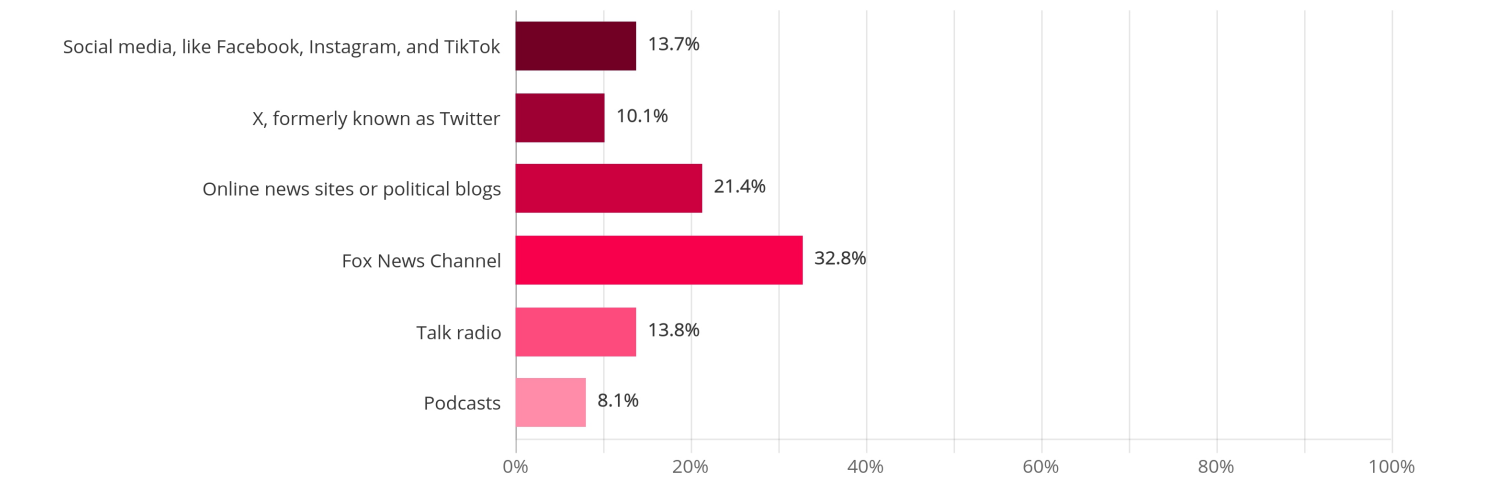

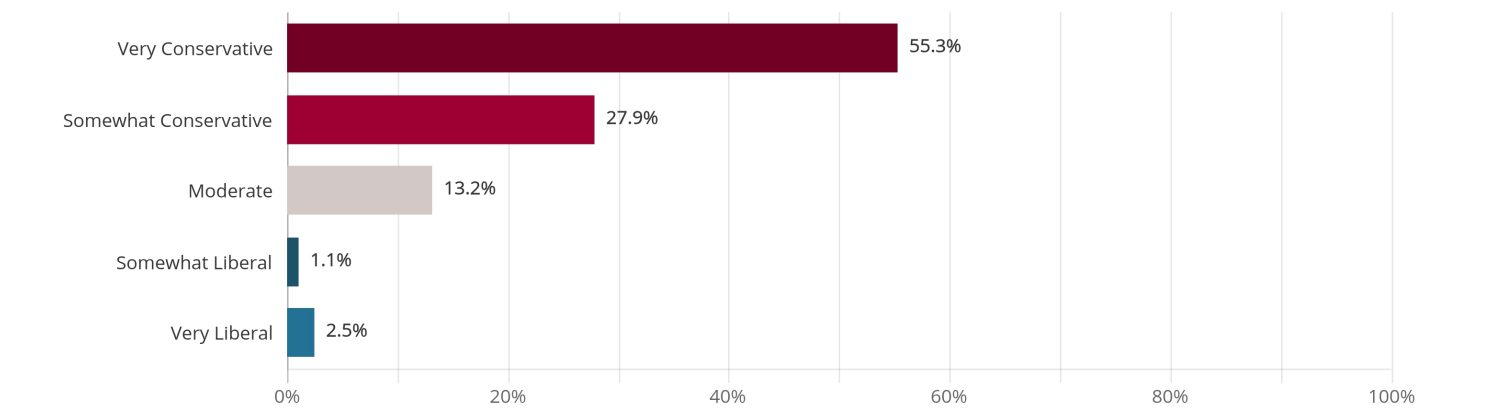
Which of the following is the single source you MOST regularly use as a source for news and information on current events?

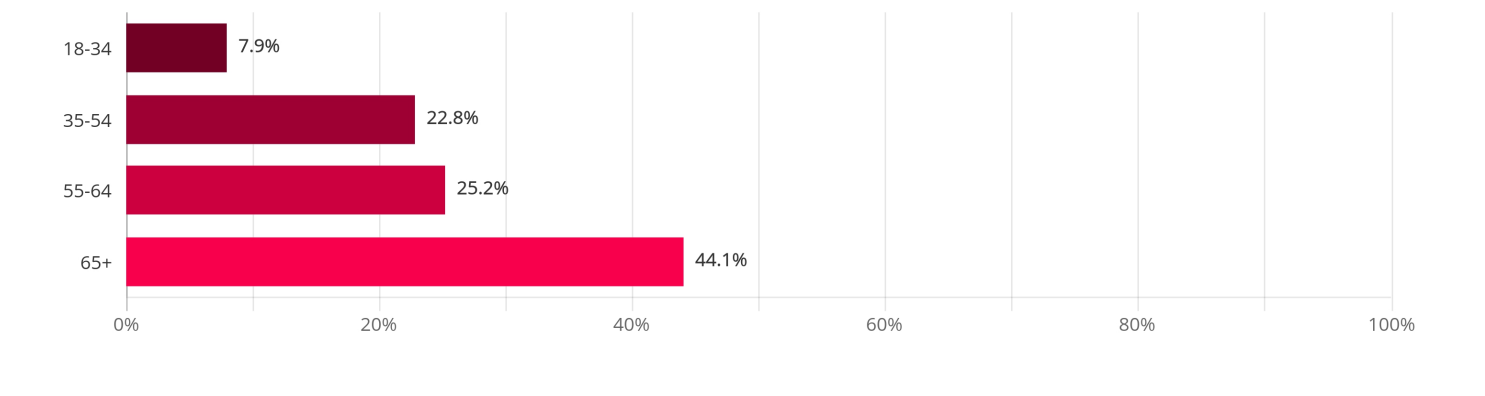

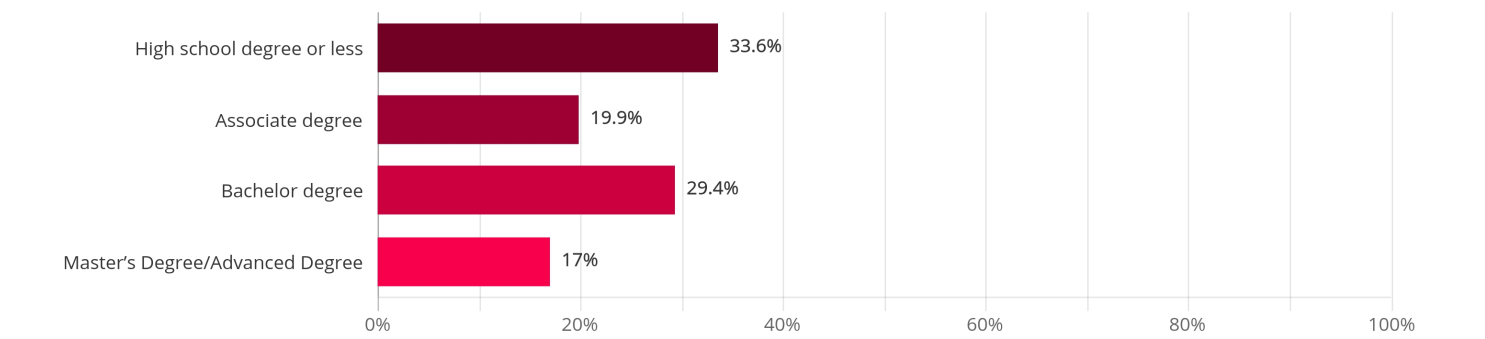

What is the highest level of education you have completed?

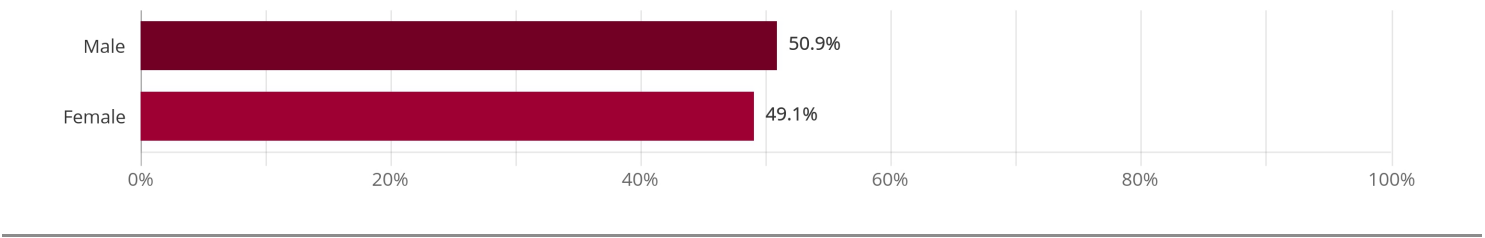

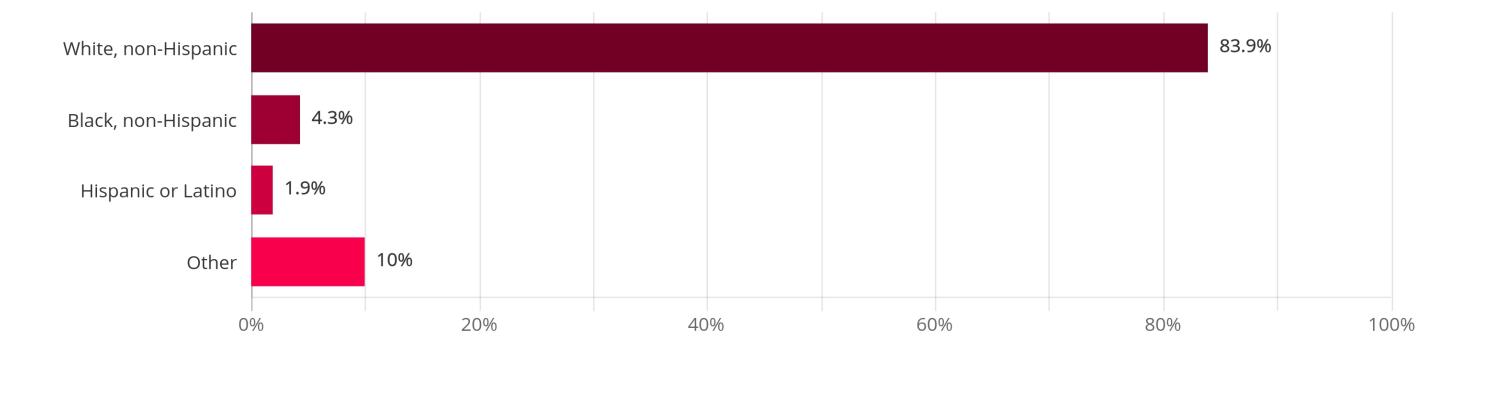

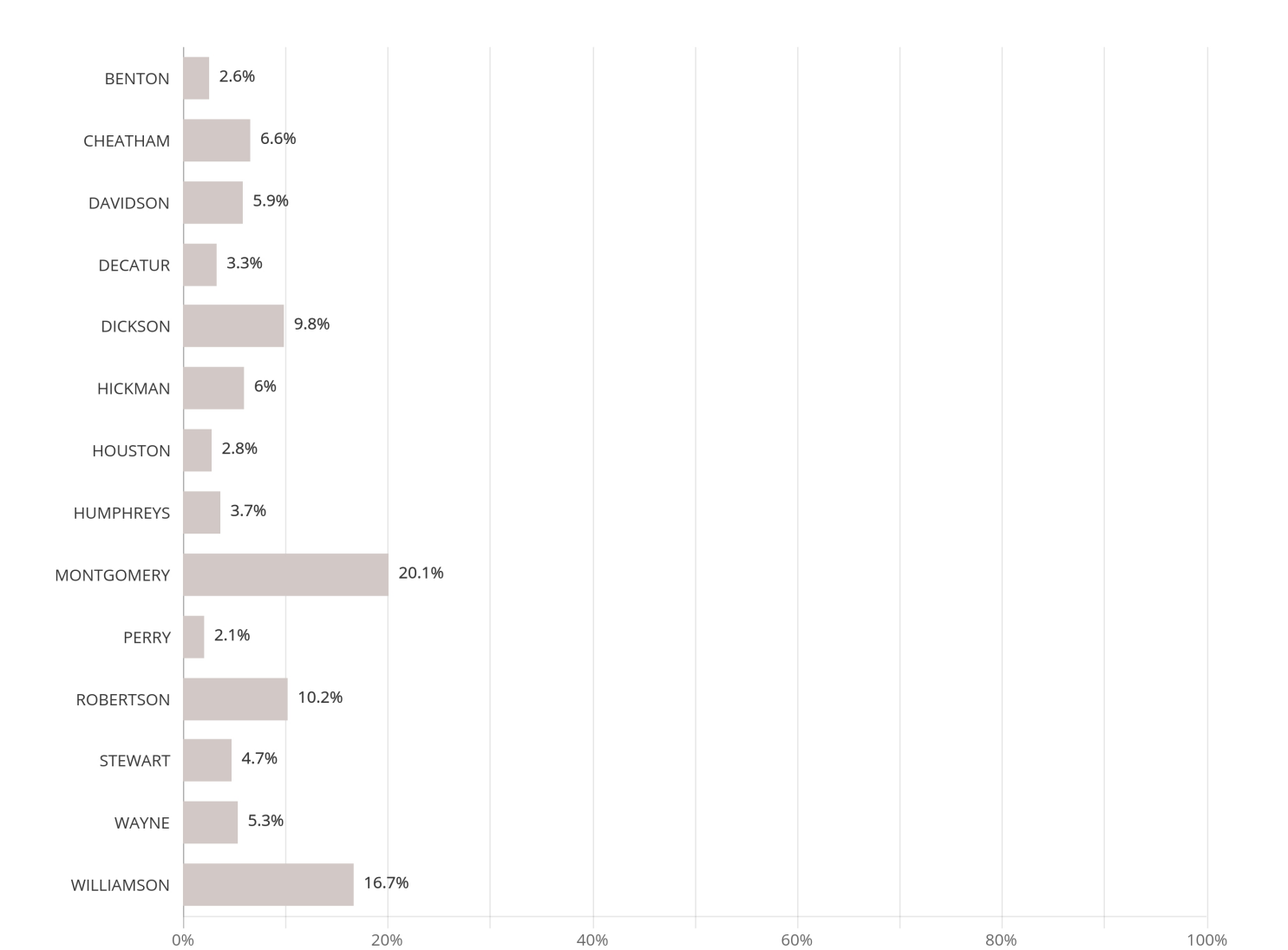
